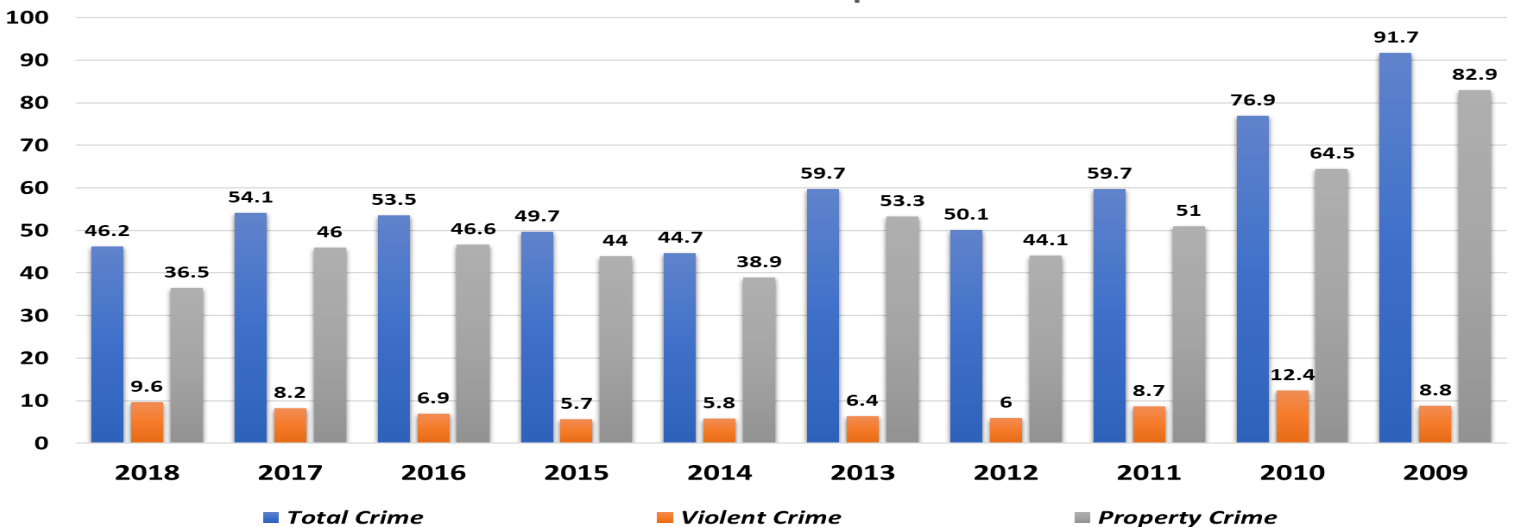

## ACTUAL CRIME VS. CRIME RATE

Currently, **Parsons is the 36th largest community** in Kansas. The last couple of years there has been a drop in the resident population even as the City has seen growth in economic growth.

As resident population shrinks even as employment grows and the city has more people working in the city, that can have an impact on the City's statistical crime per capita numbers.

So while the **per capita crime** rate for Parsons is listed as (2018 KBI-NIBRS Report):
